



DID YOU KNOW THIS?

Agmax Anti-Bloat No.2....

This bloat product is designed for pasture spraying

Use any boom or rosette spray mounted on a bike or tractor. Fine nozzles are preferred to get small particles.

1. Add 7-10mls per cow to a bucket of **warm** water. Mix well, and pour into your spray tank.
2. Top up tank with enough plain cold water to cover the paddock to be sprayed (grass needs to be just damp, not soaked... if you don't know how much water will be required, do a trial run first with just plain water in the spray tank so you can experiment).
3. Spray the paddock or pasture break. You can spray more than one paddock or break at a time (see below). Try to apply when rain in the next hour or two is unlikely.
4. The spray will begin to dry on the pasture leaf as the water content evaporates away. This will leave just the active bloat product, which becomes sticky and only warm water-soluble again. So if it rains, the product will not wash off easily because it rains cold water. It takes very heavy rain to affect the spray once it's dried out a bit. That's why some customers regularly spray 2-3 days worth of pasture in one application, with complete success.

Pasture spraying has advantages over both drenching and trough treatment:

It's better than drenching because the cow gets a little bit of product in every mouthful, rather than just a single big dose at milking. We think this makes spraying more reliable, especially in severe conditions.

It's better than trough treatment because sometimes cows will eat enough grass to cause bloat before they take a drink, especially in light drizzle or in fog, when the grass is damp.
